
Corrupt Font Cache Files in Mac OS X

When using Mac OS X, it is possible for the System font cache file to become corrupt or damaged. When this happens, some fonts will no longer preview correctly in Suitcase 10.1.x. In addition, users may see a series of numbers in their application's font menus where they would normally expect to see a font name. In at least one instance, a corrupt System font cache file prevented Suitcase 10.1.x from overriding a Mac OS X System font.

Where is this file located?

This font cache file can be found in the /System/Library/Caches directory. See screenshot below.



How do you fix this problem?

Simply delete the file mentioned above and restart your computer.

Is Suitcase responsible for this file becoming corrupt?

No, Suitcase is not responsible for the file becoming corrupt. However a corrupt font cache file does have an impact on Suitcase.
